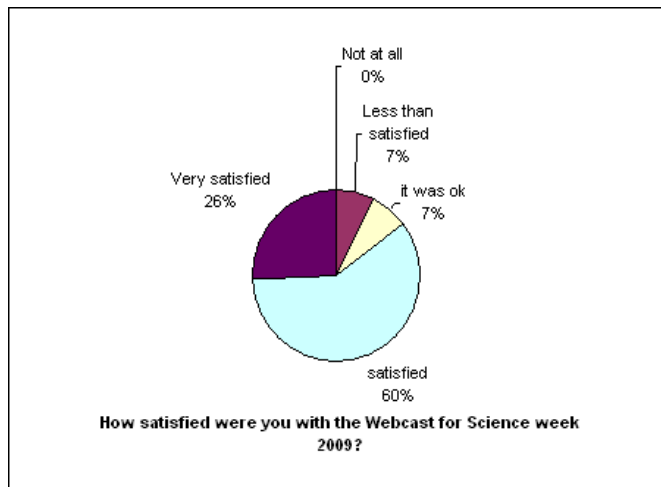


How satisfied were you with the Webcast for Science week 2009?

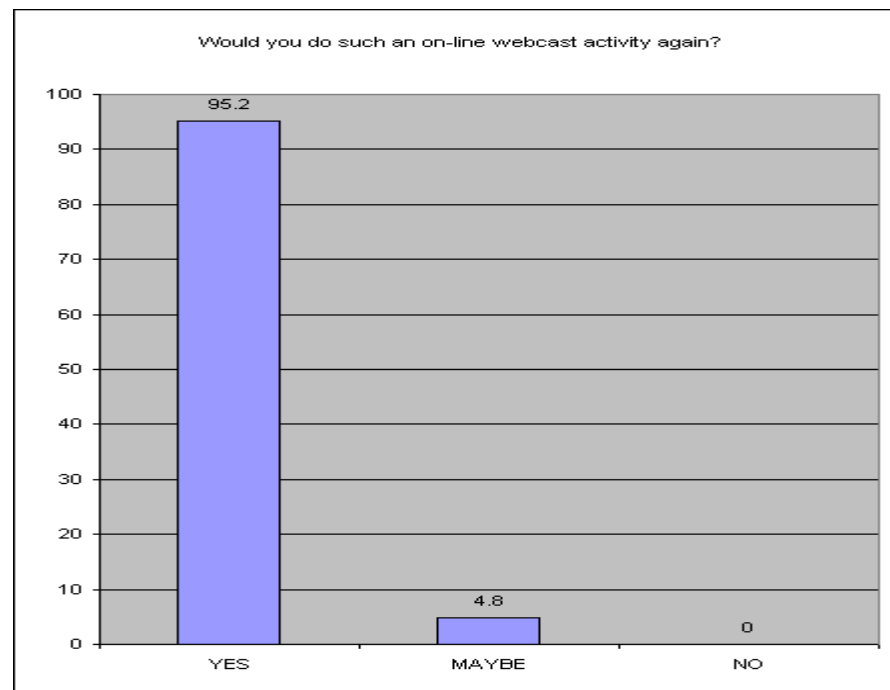
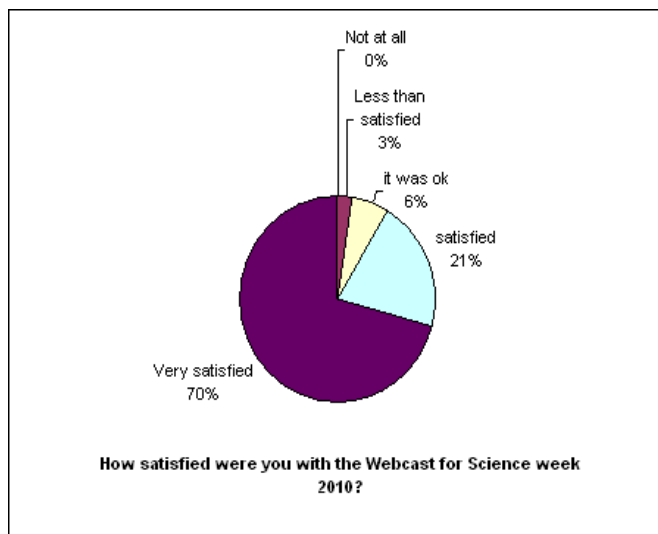
